All adults in the dugout, on the field, or regularly assisting in practices must complete a USA Softball background check (\$19) and SafeSport (free for USA Softball members). These requirements are completed on the http://www.RegisterUSASoftball.com website.

Coaches will provide names of adults that have met these requirements to your Age Group Coordinator (carolynshafer2@yahoo.com). A list of these adult's names will be filed in the league office. All adults on the field or in the dugout must display proof of meeting these requirements. If you forget your badge, a temporary replacement one can be provided by the OIC (board member on duty) on game day. Suggestion: Take a picture of your badge with your phone.

Additional Coach Registration: BA Girls Softball will pay for USA Softball registration/insurance for the team manger on file. (Note: this is different than the background check/SafeSport.) If additional coaches would like to be registered and have insurance, you can register for \$25 by completing the form online.



Broken Arrow Girls Softball League - Coach's Code of Ethics

I understand that my responsibilities as a youth coach are of great importance and that my actions have the potential to significantly influence the youth athletes I coach. Therefore, I promise to uphold the following rights of young athletes to the best of my ability.

- The right to have fun in sports.
- The right to participate in sports.
- The right to participate at a level commensurate with each child's maturity and ability.
- The right to have qualified adult leadership.
- The right to play as a child and not as an adult.
- The right of children to share in the leadership and decision-making of their sport participation.
- The right to participate in safe and healthy environments.
- The right to proper preparation for participation in sports.
- The right an equal opportunity to strive for success.
- The right to be treated with dignity and respect.

I also promise to conduct myself in accordance with the Code of Ethics for Coaches as given next:

- I will treat each athlete, opposing coach, official, parent, and administrator with respect and dignity.
- I will do my best to learn the fundamental skills, teaching and evaluation techniques and strategies of my sport.
- I will become thoroughly familiar with the rules of my sport.
- I will become familiar with the objectives of the youth sport program with which I am affiliated. I will strive to achieve these objectives and communicate them to my athletes and their parents.

CONDUCT OF MANAGERS, COACHES, PLAYERS, SPECTATORS & UMPIRES

- All managers, coaches, spectators, umpires and players will be expected to conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner.
- The BA Girls Softball League Board reserves the rights to judge any conduct detrimental to the League and take action against such parties as necessary.
- Harassment of any player by the opposing team/spectators will not be allowed. Violators will be removed from the park.
- The use of foul or profane language is prohibited. Violators will be removed from the park.
- The use of any form of tobacco (including e-cigarettes) is subject to USA Softball and BAGSL rules. This includes coaches, managers, and umpires.
- No alcoholic beverages will be allowed in the complex.
- NO ANIMALS ARE ALLOWED AT ARROWHEAD SOFTBALL COMPLEX. This is a City Ordinance.
- All managers/coaches must be USA Softball registered and have completed a background check and SafeSport certification thru BA Girls Softball.

Broken Arrow Girls Softball League - Parents' Code of Ethics Agreement

I hereby pledge to provide positive support, care, and encouragement for my child participating in youth sports/activities by following this Parents' Code of Conduct & Ethics.

I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, and officials at every game, practice, or other youth sports event.

I will place the emotional and physical well-being of my child ahead of a personal desire to win.

I will insist that my child play in a safe and healthy environment.

I will support the coaches and officials working with my child, in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all.

I will demand a sports environment for my child that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol, and will refrain from their use at all youth sports events.

I will remember that the game is for youth - not adults.

I will do my very best to make youth sports fun for my child.

I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, fans, and officials, with respect regardless of race, sex, creed, or ability.

I promise to help my child enjoy the youth sports experience by doing whatever I can, such as being a respectable fan, assisting with coaching, or providing transportation.

I will require that my child's coach be trained in the responsibilities of being a youth sports coach and that the coach upholds the Coaches' Code of Ethics.

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ARROWHEAD PARK SEVERE WEATHER POLICY

The following are the official guidelines for Severe Weather at Arrowhead Park.

The Officer in Charge (OIC), for league games, or the Tournament Director (TD) on duty or the umpires on the field may suspend play due to the threat of severe weather. Arrowhead is equipped with cable television and internet service, as well as a state-of-the-art lightning detector.

The lightning detector will blast if there is lightning within 30 miles of the park. The park <u>MUST</u> be cleared at this time. If no more lightning is detected and it doesn't sound again, then it will give three (3) short blasts which is the "ALL CLEAR" for lightning in the area.

At the first blast of the lightning detector and/or visual sighting of lightning, the games will be suspended for a minimum of 30 minutes. The fields are to be cleared and everyone is to exit the park. This means everyone is to go to their cars. All players need to take their equipment with them. If the games are cancelled, no one will be allowed back in the park. (This includes using the restroom.)

The OIC or TD will suspend all play and make sure the park is cleared.

We will also utilize a 3-flag system to notify every one of the statuses of the games. The flag will be posted at the Main entrance to the park.

GREEN – All clear, resume play.

YELLOW – Games are suspended due to the weather, wait in your car for a green or a red notification.

RED – Games are cancelled due to the weather.

Once the park is clear of severe weather, the OIC or TD will determine if play can resume in a timely manner by displaying the appropriate flag.
